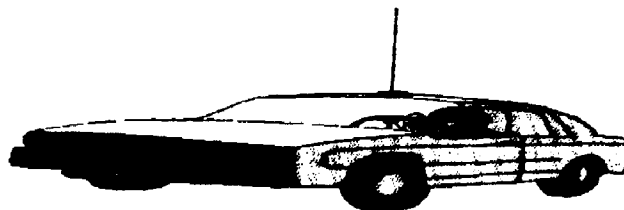
That's another reason for holding onto that roster, as you'll find his address there. Based on the willingness of the

## THE VE CORNER

(The following is reprinted from the ARRL LETTER, Jan. 26, 1994.) "Beginning March 1, 1994, the FCC will accept only the new version of its' Form 610. All other versions will be unacceptable and no longer usable for VE session, license renewal, call sign changes, etc." Quantities of the new Form 610 are available now from myself and CVFMA club officers. Only these new forms will be used at the next CVFMA VE session on Sat, March 26, 1994.

This session will take place at the Sugar River Savings Bank in Newport, NH. Doors open at 8 AM and close at 8:45 AM when the testing starts. Other 1994 test dates are June 4, September 10 and December 3. Applicants need to bring the following: 1) Two forms of positive ID (One being a photo ID driver's license) 2) The original copy of your FCC Amateur Radio License (if licensed), plus a photocopy of it. 3) Any original CSCEs you hold plus copies of same. 4) Extra pens, pencils and scratch paper. 5) \$5.75 test fee.

## VIEW FROM THE MOUNTAIN

Thanks to Butch, WB1GXM, we have a number of copies of a very interesting ARRL publication called "Welcome to Amateur Radio - All About FM Repeater Operation". New Hams joining the CVFMA will be receiving a complimentary copy. It's a great little 20 page publication and if you didn't get one with your new membership packet drop a line to the CVFMA address and request a copy. Since even old-timers can learn a thing or two here are a few examples of sections from the above:

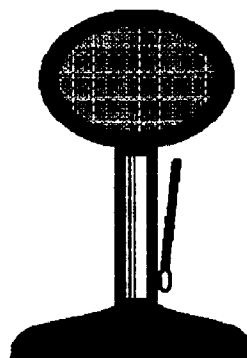
The Pause That Refreshes..."Since some Hams can't keep their thumbs off the push-to-talk (PTT) switch - it's been suggested that this button be renamed the 'Release To Listen (RTL)'. The courtesy beepers on some repeaters compel users to leave spaces between transmissions. The beep sounds a second or two after each transmission to permit new stations to transmit their call signs in the intervening time period. The conversation may continue only after the beep sounds. If a station is too quick and begins transmitting before the beep, the repeater may respond to the violation by shutting down."

Brevity..."Keep each transmission as short as possible. Short transmissions permit more people to use the repeater. All repeaters promote this practice by having timers that 'time-out', temporarily shutting down the repeater whenever the length of a transmission exceeds the preset time limit."

Identification..."You must communicate your call sign at the end of each transmission or group of transmissions and at least every 10 minutes during the course of a contact. It's illegal to transmit without identification. Aside from breaking FCC rules, it's poor operating practice to key your microphone to turn on a repeater without identifying your station."

There, just a brief example of the contents. Good common sense, too. Remember our three machines like all others are like open party lines. there are lots of folks listening - the better our operating practices are individually the better the entire amateur service looks to non-ham listeners.

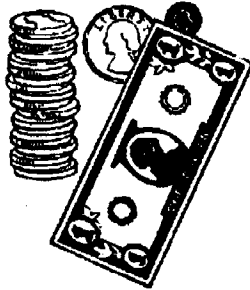


## FROM THE VAULT

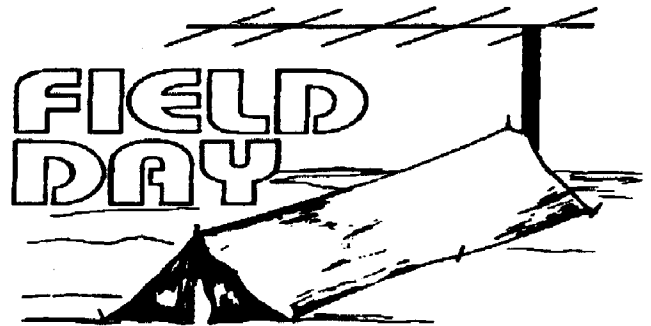

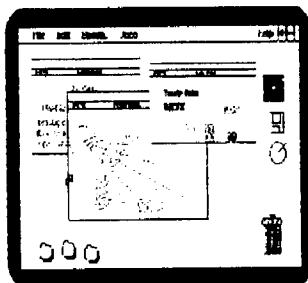

## NOT A LAUGHING MATTER - WELL MAYBE

There is an event looming in the future just waiting to bring the computer world to its knees. It's not some super virus created by some demented worm that will be implanted in the new "information superhighway". Although either of these aforementioned possibilities is enough to give computer users nightmares, the event I'm talking about is relatively unheralded.

The major catastrophe for computer users will be the result of a flaw in the basic logic of how computers read the calendar. Calendars are very difficult to perform math on. With all the different lengths of months and years simple calculations can become long and complicated.



Over the years, several systems have been created to simplify these calculations. The most popular is the Julian Date, which is a five digit number, with the first two digits as the year and the last three as the day of the year. For instance, October 10 is the 27th day of 1993; in Julian format becomes 93274.

A Julian date is an easy way to perform math on dates - like calculating when credit payments are due. There is, however, a major logic bomb in this system and the timer is ticking down. At midnight on December 31, 1999, the Julian date will jump back in time a hundred years. Check it out - December 31, 1999 in the Julian calendar is 99365; the next day, January 1, 2000, is 00001. This logic, if not corrected, could very well play havoc with many accounting systems (if a bill that's due December 31, 1999 isn't paid prior to the new year; then it won't be due until December 31, 2099).

As ridiculous as this sound, the estimates are in the hundreds of millions and maybe even as much as a billion dollars for reprogramming costs. You can expect to see a slew of special software utilities hit the market in the late nineties just to correct Julian logic. Although it's not likely that any significant number of systems will not have been fixed by 01/01/00, the variety of solutions will probably be extensive.

The real loss for the computer industry will be that of a standard that has spanned a variety of platforms. The computer industry may just start the 21st century with a large number of calendar systems - and a little egg on its face.

## ARES IN ACTION

Keep the batteries charged, make sure the generator fuel supply is rotated and adequate for extended periods and check out the emergency rigs periodically. One good way to keep an eye on the hardware is to join in on the emergency nets whenever possible. There is an ARES net on the first Tuesday of each month immediately preceding the Twin State Emergency Net on Tuesdays, 1930 EST on 146.76. All interested amateurs are invited to join in. The winter newsletter included an ARES registration form for you to fill out both for new members and renewals. I'm through with the early deluge (HI) and ready for the next wave. If you misplaced the form let me or one of the Assistant Emergency Coordinators know and you will receive on ASAP.

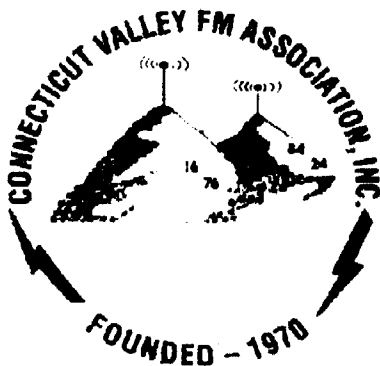
