VE CORNER

10th ANNIVERSARY

In New England, prior to 1984, to take an FCC Amateur Radio Exam, you had to make an appointment with the FCC's office at the Custom House in Boston, MA. Some exams were given every three or six months in places like Portland, ME, Burlington, VT or Hartford, CT. I can remember going to Boston for my Technician, General, Advanced and Extra tests. As many still remember, it was no fun, due to the distance, parking, and other difficulties. It can be debated long and hard if Boston has improved, but the access to and frequency of exam sites have.

In 1984, the FCC was making plans to end giving Amateur Radio exams. The Amateur Community had to make plans to take over this function. Upon learning of the FCC's decision and the ARRL's announcement that it had become a volunteer exam coordinator, I applied to the ARRL VEC to authorize the CVFMA to organize a local VE team and give exams on a quarterly basis. After the ARRL's acceptance, volunteer examiner certification took place.

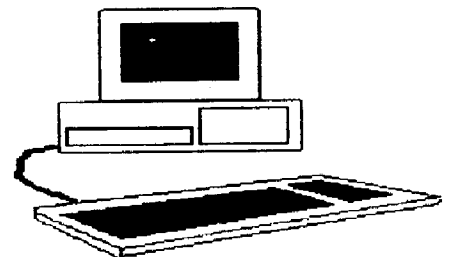
After much planning and organizing the team was ready for the first ever ARRL sponsored, CVFMA administered exam session in New Hampshire and second in New England. The

event took place at the King Ridge Ski Lodge in New London, NH, on September 16, 1984. The large room did not have very good acoustics, but the seating arrange-

ment was adequate for the large group of 37 that showed up. To date over 40 CVFMA administered test sessions, with 526 applicants in attendance attempting over 1200 test elements from September, 1984 to June, 1994 have taken place.

Since the new No-Code License Program has been in effect, more people are opting for the no_code license as their entry point into Amateur Radio, with approximately 75% upgrading to General and beyond. Additionally, more women, young people, students and family members of Hams have become licensed, increasing the overall number of Amateurs. This new mix and influx, bodes well for the hobby/service and the future of the Amateur Service.

The VE program is evolving as technology advances. If a team has the ARRL testing software and enough computers, applicants can take their theory test elements on a

computer. Once the applicants are finished, the examiners can get the test results immediately via the printer. A real time saver. Presently, a successful applicant can expect a 7-12 week wait depending on FCC staffing or other delays. The ARRL and FCC are working on, and testing an electronic filing system, so applicants can receive their new and upgrades licenses sooner.

I would like to thank all of the volunteer examiners for all their time and efforts over the last ten years. It has been a cooperative learning team effort. They put in the extra effort for the benefit of Amateur Radio and its present and future participants.

VERMONT SECTION MANAGER FACT SHEET

RE: ALLEGATIONS OF ELECTION FRAUD

1. There have been packet messages about the Vermont Section Manager election that "Someone had a real enjoyable time dumping in bogus ballots, making the election a fraud." (Consult message #3184 from KD2AJ)

2. The same packet message stated "I count around 400 votes cast out of 400 ballots sent out" *** "that's 100% voting." (Consult message #3184)

3. There were 539 full members of the ARRL eligible to vote in the election and 539 ballots were sent out. (Consult Richard Palm, K1CE, ARRL Field Services Manager)

4. The election results were: Justin Barton, WA1ITZ... 213 Mitch Stern, WB2JSJ..... 139 Barton was declared elected. (Consult page 87 of the July 1994 of QST)

5. That means that 352 ballots were returned of the 539 ballots sent out, which is a 65.3% return of the eligible ballots. (Consult your calculator, abacus or other mathematical method of your own choosing)

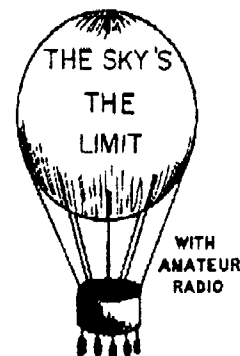
6. The packet messages WERE NOT sent by KZ1J as alleged. (Consult Joseph J. Vicere, III, KZ1J, with whom I have already consulted)

SET

Standing for Simulated Emergency Test, this years event will probably be held on the weekend of October 15-16. It is sponsored by ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) and the NTS (National Traffic System).

Why? Remember Part 97.1, subpart A..i.e., one basis and purpose of our existence is the "Recognition and enhancement of the value of the amateur service to the public as a voluntary noncommercial communication service, particularly with respect to PROVIDING EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS. On this weekend ARES units will test their plans and capabilities of moving emergency and health-and-welfare traffic into and out of disaster areas via the NTS. Get involved by contacting your local EC (Emergency Coordinator). (See masthead)

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

In light of recent discussions at the Board meetings, and due to comments from several members, a look back at proper Operating Procedures when using repeaters may be in order. Chapter 38 of the ARRL Handbook (at least the 1989 edition I have), offers the following tips. I think they are all good reminders.

- 1) Monitor the repeater to become familiar with any notable features of its operation.
- 2) To initiate a contact, simply indicate that you are listening on frequency. "This is W1XX listening" would suffice. One practice that is usually frowned upon is calling "CQ" through a repeater.
- 3) Identify legally. You must transmit your call sign at the end of each contact, and every 10 minutes during the contact. It is ILLEGAL to "kerchunk" a repeater. That is, transmitting an unmodulated carrier, as this is an unidentified transmission.
- 4) Pause between transmissions. This allows other hams to use the repeater (someone may have an emergency). On most repeaters a pause is necessary to reset the timer.
- 5) Keep transmissions short and thoughtful. Your monologue may prevent someone with an emergency from using the repeater. If your monologue is long enough, you may time-out the repeater. Your transmissions are being heard by many listeners, including non-hams with public-service monitors and scanners. Don't give them a bad impression of Amateur Radio.
- 6) Use simplex whenever possible. If you can complete your QSO or contact on a direct frequency, there is no need to tie up the repeater and prevent others from using it.
- 7) Use the minimum power necessary to maintain communications. This FCC regulation minimizes the possibility of "bringing up" distant repeaters on the same frequency.
- 8) Don't break into a contact unless you have something to add. Interrupting is no more polite on the air than it is in person.
- 9) Many repeaters are equipped with autopatch functions which, when properly accessed, connect the repeater to the telephone system, to provide a public service. An autopatch should not be used to avoid a toll call. Do not use the autopatch where regular phone service is available. Abuses of autopatch privileges may lead to their loss.
- 10) All repeaters are assembled and maintained at considerable expense and inconvenience. Usually an individual or group is responsible, and those who are regular users of a repeater should support the efforts of keeping the repeater on the air.

That's the list. Mostly common sense considering the repeater is a SHARED resource, and, like kids, the better we can share, the better we'll all get along.

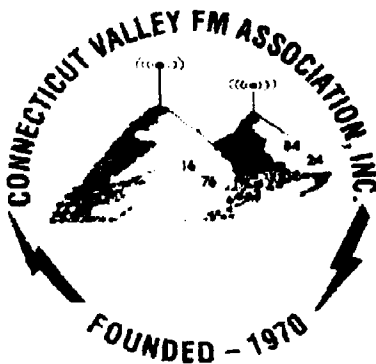
