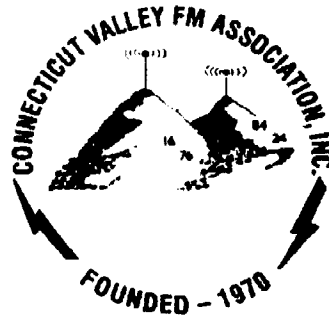

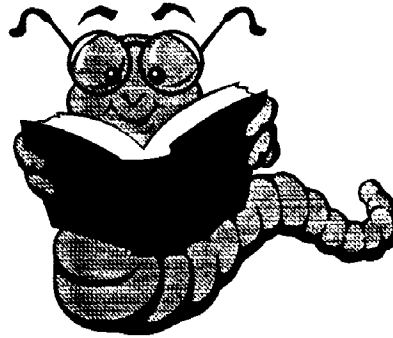

THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

At the January board of directors meeting it was noted that some members had a problem with how the board handled the recent expulsion of a member. Action of this nature is not specifically addressed in the club constitution or bylaws. The board felt that they retained the power to act as such action wasn't prohibited. A vote of members present upheld the action of the board. The board, however, voted to reinstate the expelled member with the hope that this would avoid a division of the membership.

QUESTIONNAIRE

Carl, NIJRA, the club president, has asked that the following questionnaire be presented to the membership. Any responses should be sent promptly, and in writing, ONLY, to the club address.

AUTO DIAL (1) At present the Mount Ascutney ~~repeater~~ is shut off at night due to the FCC regulation requiring the presence of a control operator whenever 3rd party traffic is handled. This disables the 911 emergency autodial during this time period. So....Are you a member of the CVFMA? Would you be interested in becoming a control operator? Are you up and available, especially during the hours of 11:30 PM to 6:30 AM? What hours and days of the week would you be available? Don't hesitate to respond, even if you would only be available for a few hours or a few days of the week. You may still be of help.

(2) Okemo Mountain in Ludlow, VT is presently being considered for the establishment of an electronics communications site. Carl has been following this matter and

attending several public informational meetings. The development of this site could eventually provide an opening for Amateurs to place a repeater there. If an electronics communications site is developed there should the CVFMA establish a two meter repeater on Okemo Mountain? (Yes, No, Don't know, Don't care.) If there is sufficient interest by the club the Board of Directors will pursue the matter further.

(3) Our lease for the use of the Vermont ETV building on Mount Ascutney needs to be renewed by June of 1996. In renegotiating the lease it may be helpful to know how c members are supporting public broadcasting. If you support public broadcasting by working at telethons, or other ways, please let Carl know..

POWER & RANGE

Did you know??? At VHF, a one watt radio talks approximately one mile on flat terrain. Doubling the power increases your range by only 33%, but doubling your antenna height increases range by 50%.

The 1-10-100 Rule: One watt will talk ten miles to a hundred foot antenna (hills, buildings or any other obstructions can reduce range by 20% to 60%)

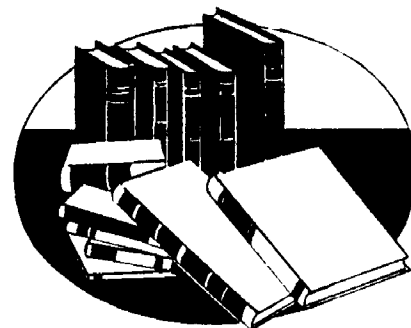
CVFMA TEST NEWS

The theme this year is "STANDARDIZATION". It took WWII to bring about the standardization of the not so complicated nut and bolt. Up to that point whoever wanted to make a thread did so. Fifty years leaves us with the British Whitworth, SAE and metric threads, not to mention the inch, decimal inch and the metric flap!

Where is this leading? In the few short years I have been in radio there have been three different versions of the phonetic alphabet. It is a hallmark to have your own phonic call. "WA1 Dirty Laundry Accepted comes

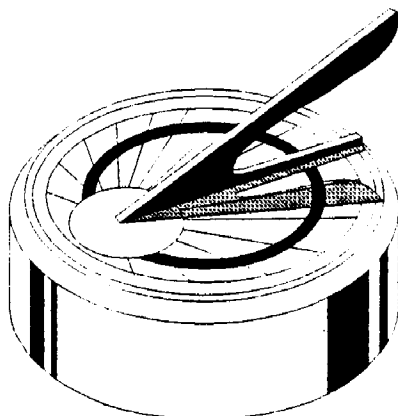
to mind. It is remembered by all, but is NOT standard. When the going gets rough the phonetics may pull a message through. So, with that said, let's try to get in the habit of using the "ITU" version. this can be found in the ARRL Net Directory, Page 6-5 or the League handout FSD-220. Most have been down this road - give it another shove!

On Tuesday, January 3, 1995 at 7:30 pm an ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) emergency communications net was begun on the Mount Ascutney repeater. The purpose of this net is to provide instruction and promote the growth of its members in emergency communications skills.

The net managers are: N1NCT, Bob/EC for Windsor County, VT; W1GUA, Rudy/EC for Sullivan County, NH; and KL7DN, Darrel/DEC for District #4 (Windsor and Windham Counties) in VT. If you've checked into one of more of the net's meetings so far, we thank you. If you haven't yet joined us, please feel free to jump in. The water's fine. Membership in ARES is encouraged, but not necessary for being a part of the net. Likewise, membership in the net is not restricted to residents of Windsor or Sullivan Counties only. Anyone within accessing range of the repeater is more than welcome.

As of this newsletter

issue's deadline training has been provided in the correct way to check into a directed net, the proper use of ITU phonetics, repeater operation protocol, basic communication theory, the principles of disaster communications and an explanation of what ARES is and its' relationship to RACES.

Future plans call for SKYWARN training session, "desktop" exercises, a mobile exercise to improve geographical knowledge of the net coverage area, and a REAL field exercise.

The net was authorized on a temporary basis (till March 28) by the Board of Directors. To assure its' continuance in the future, if you feel that this n has proven to be a worthwhile use of our repeater and provides a needed service to area Hams, the net managers request that you let members of the Board know your feelings. They're listed on the masthead. Comments heard at random have been very positive. Don, KD1KM, stated that "The net is going great. Enthusiasm is high." In a packet "chat" with AA1IR, Bob, he noted that it is definitely a worthwhile venture.

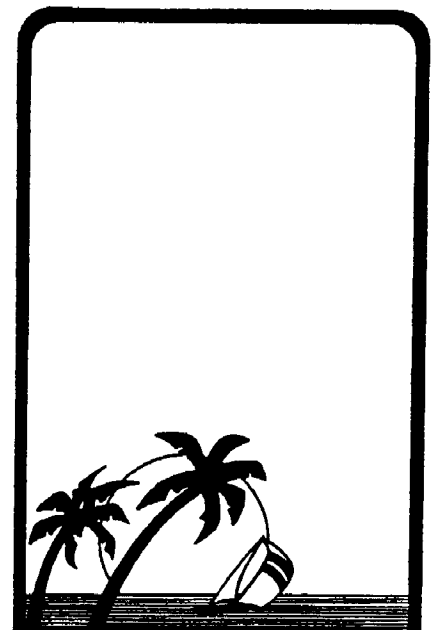
